Business: To amend the Constitution of Killcare Surf Life Saving Club as follows:

Replace existing

Clause 19. Annual Subscriptions which states

- (a) All annual subscriptions shall be payable in advance on the first day of the Club's financial year.
- (b) If the subscription of any member is still unpaid at the expiration of four months after the due date or the Annual General Meeting which ever occurs first, the management committee shall declare that they cease to be a member.
- (c) If the subscription is still unpaid at the expiration after the due date such person shall be removed from the roll of members and their membership shall cease on that date and they shall not be eligible for reelection except by a unanimous vote at the meeting of the management committee.

With

Clause 19. Annual Subscriptions

- (a) The membership year means the period from the 1st day of October in one year to the next succeeding last day of September.
- (b) The secretary shall notify members not later than the 1st day of September each year that their annual membership subscriptions are due and payable.
- (c) Any person who has not paid his or her annual membership subscription by the beginning of a membership year shall be deemed an un-financial member and lose all rights and privileges of membership.
- (d) If a persons annual membership subscription is not paid within one month after the beginning of any membership year, that persons name shall be removed from the register of members.
- (e) Any person so removed from the register of members may re-apply for membership but shall pay any entrance fee with the annual membership subscription as determined by the management committee in accordance with clause 18.
- (f) Any member who is a financial member as at the 31st April 2008 shall continue to be a financial member until 30th September 2008.

And as a consequence, it is necessary to change Clause 20(b) by the deletion of the words "at the close of the financial year".

It gives me a great deal of pleasure to submit this report for the 2007/2008 season.



Treasurer's Report

Once again I would like to thank our auditor, Darrol Harmer, for his continued support of our club in auditing our financials, and which he has done for numerous years.

There were a couple of good social events held this season. The 75th Anniversary Dinner which was well attended and quite a social highlight, and 'Last Drinks' night was held on the Australia Day weekend prior to demolition of the surf club, this night was both financially and socially successful where a net profit of \$4,324 was made.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF KILLCARE SURF LIFESAVING CLUB INC

Scope

The financial report comprises the Summary of Balances and Receipts and Payments statements for the General, Fundraising and Term Deposit Bank Accounts of the Killcare Surf Lifesaving Club Inc for the year ended 30 April 2008. The Committee of Killcare Surf Lifesaving Club Inc is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion to the members. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal control and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

Chief Instructors Report




