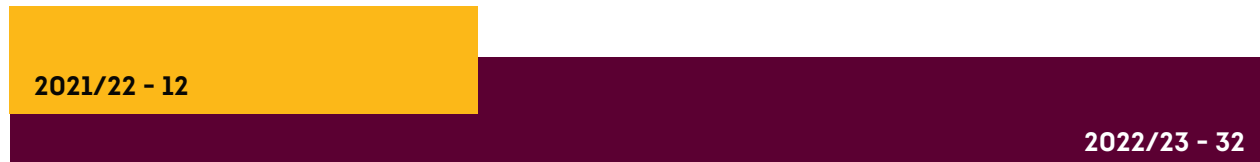

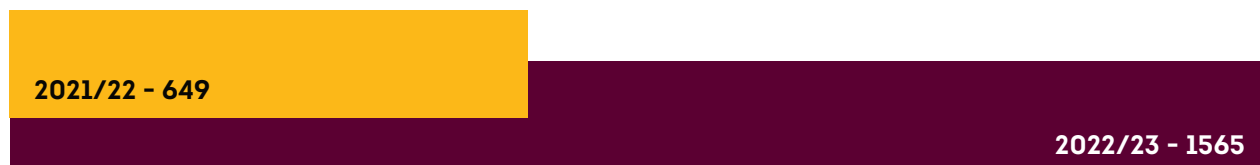

President's Report

Craig Sheppard

After a tumultuous couple of years it was great to have some sense of normality back for season 2022/23. That normality and some fantastic weather brought its own difficulties with bumper crowds particularly through the holiday periods however as always our lifesavers handled everything that came their way. To everyone who spent time under the tent, we offer the profound thanks of the club and the community.

The country sadly saw a horrific drowning toll last year - all on unpatrolled beaches - but the crowds that came to the patrolled beaches highlights a desperate need for more education amongst the general public, particularly those from away from the coast. Bravado, apathy and ignorance led to some enormous statistics for our crew - 32 rescues and over 1,500 preventative actions, many of which were moments away from turning into a rescue. Public education is an area that is being worked on by the clubs and branch and we look forward to participating however we can.

It's fair to say the patrols would have struggled without the dedication of our Directors of Lifesaving Luke Hayter and Matt Hayter. They had a very busy season filling gaps and shuffling people around to maintain our compliance and is the reason they were very worthy winners of the RJ Tubby trophy.

Of particular note this season was Killcare placing 3rd in the Branch Patrol Competition, 1 point behind 2nd place Ocean Beach, who were 1 point behind 1st place Umina. This is a testament not only to the patrollers but also our Education portfolio led by Stephen Pearson. Particular mention should go to Patrol 8 under Steve McCoombe who had the pressure of being audited twice out of the four.

Education is an increasingly difficult area that Stephen has wrangled brilliantly once again. The headline numbers are 8 new Bronze and 12 new SRC's but it's so much more than that. We'd also like to thank Jason Smith (Ocean Beach) and Tim Pittolo (Terrigal) for the huge amount of assistance they offered in training and assessment. We beg all our award holders to complete their requals - online and physical - as soon as possible.

Stephen also spearheaded another highlight of the season, the Community Day, which brought together the Killcare/Wagstaffe RFB, Maritime Services, the Police, the Australian UAV Service and of course ourselves to gather our community in one place with messages of surf safety, bushfire preparedness and boating safety. We ran rolling CPR and Defib demos and the UAV Service showed how we're putting eyes in the sky to keep beachgoers safe. It was a wonderful day that's we're aiming for bigger and better this year on the 24th of September.

Our admin team of Therese Buckley, Jill Williams and new recruit Janey Howe had another stellar run that saw us get full marks in the SLSNSW annual audit, ensuring that we are complying with all statutory requirements of what is a pretty complex business.

On the finance front, while we show a small deficit compared to last years surplus, we've seen a slew of new equipment and big ticket upgrades to the building including a new Thundercat IRB, new IRB road trailer and a \$43,000 complete overhaul of the hot water system. We are also soon to take delivery of our own ATV which will leave us properly rescue ready all year round and give us double the mobile capability in the season. All things considered Therese has once again done a marvellous job of keeping us on a solid financial and regulatory footing.

We must be cognisant that our building is reaching the age where increasing expenses will be need to be incurred. Nic Urie continues to work very hard to keep the walls up and the water out however, given the environment it is in, things large and small are starting to need replacement rather than repair.

Part of our central mission is fostering the next generation of lifesavers and to that end our Nippers program continues to excel under the leadership of Emily Buckley. Emily and her team of age managers had a fantastic season. Our U14's ended their nippers journey with Scott Leivesley, Paul Ansell, Debs Haig

and Donny Macdonald helping them achieve their SRC in very challenging conditions and they are all to be congratulated. Of particular note are their age managers Dave McGarvey and Martin Haig who have been with them since they were U6. Our special congratulations to Sebi Ansell, this years winner of the JM MacFadyen Rookie of the Year award.

All the age managers do such a wonderful job however I'd like to note Clea Langton who took it upon herself to work with some neurodivergent nippers in a small pilot program. We'd love to see all our community kids reach their best and some need a little more help. Thanks Clea for offering that to them.

Retaining the kids after Nippers is a challenge everywhere but our youth engagement team of Makayla Redman, Jess Leivesley and Zac Webb have done their utmost to keep the 'Krakens' interested and offer opportunities for activities and learning. It's also great to see them working to break down the club barriers and collaborate with Ocean Beach and others to broaden the opportunities for all clubs.

The Frigid Digits Winter Swimmers are close to completing their first season since their integration with the club and they have been a wonderful addition, socially and in more practical ways such as helping out on the bar and around the club.

There are so many people that work so hard behind the scenes to keep the club not just running, but thriving. Sue Fraser in particular can be seen doing everything from stocking the fridge to sweeping the paths and is an all-round stalwart of the club. Sue is also our Vice-President Social and has organised some wonderful events for members and visitors this year which bring the community together and are an important revenue stream.

I'd like to personally thank Tony Newton for the enormous hours of pro bono work he's given the club in some difficult legal matters, let's hope the dust has settled now.

Running a surf club is a pretty complex and unusual business that requires significant funding. We thank our principal sponsor Belle Property for their continued support. The support of Central Coast Council, the NSW State Government and the Commonwealth Government is again most welcome and appreciated. Helena and the team at the Killcare Beach Kiosk continue to be wonderful supporters and we're immensely grateful for everything they do.

As always, however good the season, there is always room for improvement and we look forward to a wonderful and safe season 2023/24.

The flags go up on September 23, see you on the beach for our 92nd season!

Once again Killcare Surf Life Saving Club has continued to support this wonderful community and its beach goers. Throughout the year the committee have endeavored to maintain the current club facilities whilst working towards improving our core business objectives with the latest equipment and facilities available.

Overall, there was a small deficit from ordinary activities in the 2022/2023 financial year which amount to \$5,082. There was, however, a larger than normal Income in Advance allocation due to the Office of Sports grant not being finalised by years end and rent in advance from Koworks.

With the club building being close to 13 years old there is a noticed increase in general repairs and maintenance which the club is responsible for. This year that included the update of the cool room equipment and fit out to the cost of \$9300. We also replaced many of the lights to LED in the entire building and other electrical works.

On a more positive note, we were able to obtain grants from all levels of government to help with our core objectives. The grants received this financial year were:

- Central Coast Council 2022/2023 Beach Safety Operations
- Central Coast Community Grant – Purchase of new trailer
- Office of Sports – SMAR Swimmers Kit – Purchase of personal equipment for emergency response members
- SLS Australia BSEF – has been allocated for new radios & AED
- SLS NSW Compliance Grant
- Office of Sports SCFP Grant – has been allocated for new Solar Hot Water and update of shower fixtures and fittings.

Income from SIPS, function bookings and Community Connect also continues to grow.

As I sit down to pen another covering letter for this year's financial report it amazes me the amount and quality of the work that is achieved by a hard-working volunteer group. This includes the small but dedicated committee, all those amazing patrollers, members who are involved in the Nippers program and the many volunteers serving behind the bar.

I must also say a huge thank you to the wonderful Admin Officers who support the committee and our club members. We said goodbye to Heather last September after 5 wonderful years and wish her all the best in her travels around Australia. Our new Admin Officer, Janey Howe, had a very quick introduction to the way of the surf lifesaving club, joining in September just as the season started. Thank you, Janey, for all your hard work and great enthusiasm for the role.

Also, a big thank you to all the members who have supported the club over year.

Director of Education Stephen Pearson

Firstly, my appreciation and thanks to the great group of people who work so hard to keep the Club delivering on its mission.

Thanks to all the patrollers who turn up and dedicate their time on patrol.

To the trainers who put in the extra hours above their patrol duties. Scott Leivesley continues to do outstanding work with the SRC group. Donny Macdonald for helping out with board skills. To the great support we receive from other Clubs and especially Jason Smith from Ocean Beach SLSC and Tim Pittolo from Terrigal SLSC.

To the whole of the Management Committee of the Club who strive to make the Club function, perform its obligations and deliver a community club for all to participate in. A big thank you to Janey, who has really has taken over from Heather and has excelled in all aspects of supporting me in my role.

A much better season weather wise and this year we actually trained on the beach for the first time in two years.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Eight new Bronze members – six from our own course and two from an SRC to BM transition through Ocean Beach.
- 12 New SRCs – Another great effort from Scott Leivesley and his team. The paperwork alone exceeded that length of a patrol board.
- Requals were hard and again required individual attention to achieve completion. All Bronze through but very last minute. SRC requals again suffered from a lack of resources to chase and remind. Jason Smith performed a huge service by getting our IRB awards through.
- First Aid award status was maintained across the season building on the improvements from 2021 and 2022. The merits of training our new Bronzes up to a higher standard under the 'Provide First Aid' Award was again proven. Just about maintained an advanced resuscitation award holder on each Patrol.
- Four new Patrol Captain award holders passed a much longer course.
- IRB Driver and Crew was really tough going again but we just about maintained a full crew for each patrol. Would be good to get a couple more through and more evenly balanced across patrols.
- The Beach Operations App is now fully bedded in and Patrols appear comfortable in use
- The SLSA's over 65 program 'Silver Salties' was started up but beyond the Frigid Digits we have not been able to expand on its potential
- The addition of the winter swimmers 'Frigid Digits' as a club within the club has proven successful but stronger integration is required. The FDs contributed three RSAs for Sips.
- Working more closely with other Clubs especially Umina, Ocean Beach and Macs.

GOING FORWARD

Recruit more Bronzes and Surf Rescue Certificate – The Community Day worked ok this year with a good turnout. Will repeat next year as a recruitment and registration focus.

Requals – I can't see any other way other than a patroller-by-patroller effort. Some are fine but the majority need help and support at every step. This is a massive amount of my time September to December – every weekend from October. It was touch and go whether we achieve compliance by 31st December.

SRC to BM –The SRC stream coming through to BM is very important to the club to maintain patrols numbers and ability. We have a volunteer gap in making this happen. We just don't have the bandwidth currently and it hurts as this group is a great resource pool to ensure our Patrols have sufficient capability. They are also just an awesome group of great teenagers and a real credit to the Club.

IRB – As with last we are struggling for crew and drivers despite numbers being ok this year and we have to recognise that we will be dependent on Oceans Beach and other Clubs for training for the foreseeable future. We were too reliant on our great Directors of Lifesaving and others to fill in gaps.

First Aid – First Aid requirements are continually moving and changing. Advanced Resuscitation is changing with a move to a new award in 2024 and this may have a big impact on our Patrols.

Other awards and training – There are potential opportunities to build other training options and always happy to take on suggestions.

COMMENTARY

Frankly nothing has changed from last year.

For a small Club we have achieved great results due to the commitment of our trainers and members.

But we struggle at times to cover all the requirements and regrettably there have been a small number of instances where we have been as responsive as we should. This has particularly impacted our SRC group and I apologise to those affected. Unfortunately while I will institute changes the lack of volunteers means we will always be at risk.

Frankly we are too small a Club to build/maintain a full training function. I believe that there should be better co-ordination across the Clubs and training should have several Clubs participating and co-ordinated by Branch. I realise this means some independence will have to be lost but my focus is on our core mission.

Training compliance and requirements are continually changing. The paperwork requirements are particularly onerous. To keep ahead of the changes in awards is a significant effort alone. SLSA do not appear to understand the impact of these continual changes have on our patrollers. We are volunteers and maintaining capability is very time consuming. Further the paperwork and process is always pushed downwards away from paid positions. Simple confirmations already in Surfguard need to be manually reconfirmed from Club level back up to SLSA.

New technology and better software is promised by SLSA. But in the three years I have been in the role nothing materially has happened. If anything the use of technology has gone backwards. The requirement to complete a 5 minute elearning course for requals was a complete waste of time for me and the patrollers. It isn't good enough to have an app it needs to work in the real environment of a small club.

As with last year and finishing on a positive note I have again seen several rescues this year and I am absolutely sure that we would have seen fatalities without the intervention of our dedicated and brave patrollers. If I have made even the smallest of contributions to skilling up or supporting those patrollers I have been amply rewarded.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 2009*, the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991* and associated regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Killcare Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is an association registered under the *Associations Incorporations Act 2009* and domiciled in New South Wales.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purpose of complying with the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commissions Act 2012* and associated regulations. The Executive Committee have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of the Killcare Surf Life Saving Club Limited.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the AASB and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements'; AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows'; AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors'; AASB 1048 'Interpretations of Standards'; AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures' as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Accounting Policies

Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the Association and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Sale of goods

Sale of goods revenue is recognised at the point of sale, which is when the customer takes receipt of the goods, the risks and rewards are transferred to the customer and there is a valid sales contract. Amounts disclosed as revenue are net of sales returns and discounts.

Functions and Events

Revenue from functions and events are recognised once the event is held in the Club facilities and has met its obligations to provide a venue for the expressed purpose agreed with the parties. The receipts and deposits take are treated as deferring functions and events revenue liabilities until the events is completed.

Membership fees

Revenue from membership fees is recognised at time of receipt.

Grants and donations

Grant & donation income is recognised as revenue when received unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as prepaid income on the balance sheet.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Plant and Equipment / Surf Patrol Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised in the profit or loss as revaluation decreases if the impairment losses relate to the revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, including buildings and capitalised lease assets is depreciated on a straight line or diminishing-value basis over the asset's useful life to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Plant and Equipment	5 - 25%
Surf Patrol & Sports Equipment	10 – 20%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss in the period which they arise. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included in other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Income Tax

As the Association is a charitable institution in the terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.
