We would like to pay tribute to the following people:

Zac Webb, a stalwart of club for many years is stepping down from committee roles and thank you for all you have done. Luke & Matt Hayter are stepping down as Directors of Lifesaving and we thank you for both your efforts to keeping us safe on the beach. Emily Buckley who has been with the club in a variety of roles including Nippers, Patrol Captain and Director of Junior Activities is moving interstate and we wish her all the best. We have been very fortunate that Emily has been an active member and held many positions at Killcare Surf Lifesaving Club and we thank her for everything she has done for the club.

Thank you to Tony Newton who has contributed many pro-bono hours to assist with legal matters for Killcare Surf Club.



Thank you to the work of Therese Buckley as Director of Finance as Killcare Surf Club has a small deficit this year of \$5082 while we have increased our advanced income to \$59,035 as KoWorks as tenant have paid in advance and we have also received the hot water grant contribution.

The income for Sunday Sips has increased this year coupled with an increase in function bookings and community connect bookings for various classes held during the week in the Surf Club for the local community. Thank you for Director of Finance's eighth report for Finance and for all the work that Therese has done to maintain the financial stability of the club while also supporting the beach patrollers, club members and local community.

Repairs on the surf club building have increased as the building is starting to show its age with \$9000 plus for electrical work as well as the grant money the club has received including the Central Coast grant and Community Grant to purchase a new trailer, swimmers kit for emergency responses. Through Surf Lifesaving Australia the Surf Club has also received an annual beach fund, a compliance grant from Surf Lifesaving NSW and an ATV grant.

Thank you to Janey Howe who started as the Administration Officer in September 2023 and thank you to Heather Pate who resigned from the Administration Officer role to enjoy travel and retirement with her husband.

There have been a number of preventives this season that have been recorded. The Patrol Captains have done a terrific job this year while Matt and Luke Hayter have excelled in their co-leading Director roles.

The Director of Education, Stephen Pearson, has been able to have the opportunity to see other clubs and achieve great results due to our dedicated patrollers and Patrol Captains and the training provided pre-season and throughout the season.

A big thanks to the Patrols who achieved third place in Central Coast Surf Lifesaving branch competition with one point behind Ocean Beach which was only one point behind Umina Beach. A special shout out to Steve McCoombe and his patrol who were raided twice in the season.

It is important that we can bring in new patrollers and this is one of the reasons we hold our Community Day annually where we include a registration and information desk for people in the local community to learn more about the club and want to become active members. Combine SRC's into bronze medallion award.

And those documented patrol hours are just the beginning; to even set foot on the beach they must first train, qualify and requalify and that area just gets more complex every year. It is a testament to the dedication and sheer determination of our Director of Education Stephen Pearson that we are able to do so. In sometimes trying circumstances Stephen continues to get, and keep, the team up to scratch.

It is becoming ever more obvious that, while we all wear our club cap with pride, to prosper our club colours must be red and yellow. In that spirit we thank trainers and assessors from all over the Coast for their help in completing many of the courses. Our own stock of trainers has been lacking however we have a major boost for the upcoming season and look forward to returning the favour.

Many of tomorrow's Surf Life Savers can be found causing mayhem every Sunday morning at Nippers. While it was a terrific season, I'll be the first to admit it wasn't our best and I take full responsibility for that. Our Age Managers did a truly outstanding job despite my shortcomings however I am pleased to report that Kristian Peacocke has stepped up as Director of Junior Activities and has already brought a new energy and enthusiasm to the program before it's even started. 2024/25 promises an incredible season for the kids.

Of course when they get to the U14's, Nippers comes to an end and we look forward to transitioning the 'Krakens' into the senior ranks. Our U14 cohort is a great bunch but particular congratulations to the JM MacFadyen Rookie of the Year, Nate Redman.

Keeping the kids engaged with the club when they get jobs, knuckle down to study and all the other fun of being a teen is always a challenge. It was my pleasure to chaperone some of our youth crew up to Camden Haven SLSC for a weekend of fun and patrolling with a great mate of the club, Pete Bagnell. Put together by Junior Club Captains Jess Leivesley and Makayla Redman, the trip showed one thing above all else - our future is in good hands. On that note, the thanks of the club to Makayla who, having turned 18, will be stepping down from her current role at the upcoming AGM.

It was a relatively quiet year on the sporting front but our Masters flew the flag proudly. At Branch Champs in the water, Bruce Johnson picked up 4th in his Surf Race, Andrew Stevenson got 3rd in his Surf Race and Peter Harbison 2nd in his. They then backed up to States where Andrew and Bruce picked up 9th and 10th respectively in the Surf Race, and then Andrew pushed through for the Tube Race where he made it through to the semis. Our most outstanding results were, fittingly for us, on the beach where Tony Brown picked up gold in the 65-69 yrs 1Km Beach Run, gold in the Beach Flags and gold in the Beach Sprint at Branch, then gold in the 1km run, silver in the flags and 4th in the sprint at States.

We hope to see a lot more of the Killy cap at comps from Nippers through Opens to Masters next season.

To make all this happen on the beach and in the water requires running a complex business with more regulatory oversight than most. My deep thanks goes to the board and committee - Therese Buckley, Nic Urie, Stephen Pearson, Kurt Vella, Jill Williams, Sue Fraser, Scott, Jane and Jess Leivesley, Makayla Redman, Michael Warnock and Stephen Hinks for all that they do. It is with some sadness that we bid farewell to





Nic as of the upcoming AGM but if there's one person in our history who has 'done their time' it is Nic. His tenure began in 2009/10 as Gear Steward and has extended to his current roles as Vice President Club and House. We wish Nic and Annie happy and safe travels in 2025 and thank them both for everything they have given to the club.

Our admin team of Therese Buckley, Jill Williams and our Admin Officer Sarah Gutierrez had another stellar run that saw us get full marks in the SLSNSW annual audit, ensuring that we are complying with all statutory and 'best practice' requirements. My particular thanks to Therese who does an incredible job year after year as Director of Finance and also takes on so much more in and around the club.

We are so very grateful for the support of our sponsors; Major sponsor Belle Property, Central Coast Council, the NSW State Government, the Commonwealth Government and dear friends of the club, the Killcare Beach Kiosk. Thanks also to 5 Star Swim School who donated the use of their facility and Newton's Law for their pro bono work.

A particular thanks goes to our neighbours Mark and Rikki Landini who made an extremely generous donation to enable the almost complete refit of the gym.

This season saw two significant cash inputs; Surf Life Saving Central Coast gave a one-off grant of \$8,000 to each of the 15 clubs under their banner which will be used for operational, nippers and training equipment. Surf Life Saving NSW surprised with a \$1,000,000 cost of living support package distributed amongst all NSW clubs. In keeping with the intent of the funding, at Killcare this will be used directly on the membership - all patrollers, age managers and office bearers both at committee and sub-committee level will have complimentary membership for 2024/25 and a reserve will be kept for any hardship requests for nipper membership. Both SLSCC and SLSNSW are to be applauded for the good governance that made these grants available.

I would also like to congratulate and thank Surf Life Saving Central Coast and Central Coast Council for the great initiative in putting rescue tubes in strategically placed locations all over the Coast, with the focus on unpatrolled spots. Last year saw truly tragic incidents where people died trying to rescue family unaided. These aim to alleviate that in a simple but very effective way and have already seen at least one high profile use with a successful outcome. Our stretch of beach has two already in place with more to come.

As always, however good the season, there is always plenty of room for improvement. We look forward to a wonderful and safe season 2024/25.

The 2023/2024 season was another successful year for Killcare Surf Life Saving Club

This financial year produced a surplus of \$55,532 from ordinary activities, a turnaround from the slight deficit of \$5,082 last season.

The committee has continued to focus on maintaining and improving the club facilities for all club members and the local community. One main area was the upgrading of the club gym which was only made possible with a very generous donation from a local family.

Grants received during the 2023/2024 financial year include:

- Central Coast Council CSP Grant 23/24 – Purchase of new bar fridge and baby change table
- Central Coast Council 23/24 Partnership Support for Beach Safety Operations – purchase of essential surf lifesaving equipment
- Department of Justice Grant – purchase of the clubs own ATV
- NSW Government Small Business Safework Grant – purchase WHS equipment
- SLS Australian 23/24 Grant – purchase of essential surf lifesaving equipment
- SLS Annual Compliance Grant – used to cover general ongoing running costs of the club

The club continues to see increased function bookings and attendance at Sunday SIPS which has increased our annual turnover. This season the social committee organised several great fundraising nights, including Blues by the Beach, A night of Laughs with Hypnotist Greg Hudson and the very successful, Faulty Towers Dinner Experience.

I would like to acknowledge and personally thank the following groups and individuals whom without their support and hard work the club wouldn't be able to operate. They are:

# Director of Education Stephen Pearson

Firstly, my appreciation and thanks to the great group of people who work so hard to keep the Club delivering on its mission.

Thanks to all the patrollers who turn up and dedicate their time on patrol.

To the trainers who put in the extra hours above their patrol duties. I have received continued support from across the Club. I will highlight a few among many: as always Scott Leivesley has helped and organised on top of his duties elsewhere; John Cvetko joined this year and has applied his considerable talents to train our Bronzes and IRB teams; Jo Bramble, who also joined this year, spent significant time on first aid requals and training and we are lucky to have her at the Club. A big thank you to Craig for stepping in and helping us get through an impasse in the bureaucracy.

To the whole of the Management Committee of the Club who strive to make the Club function, perform its obligations and deliver a community club for all to participate in.

Weather was ok and we were able to train on the beach most sessions.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Eleven new Bronze members, up from eight last year.
- Seven new IRB Crew and with the hope we can roll this onto the Driver award.
- One new Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue
- Only one new Silver Medallion Patrol Captain. We need more Patrol Captains.
- Three new Advanced Resuscitation Techniques ('ART') award holders
- Finally, I achieved trainer status after three years of working the requirements. It shouldn't be that long for anyone. Incredibly John Cvetko and Jo Bramble joined and all of a sudden, we have an extra Trainer and a Facilitator.
- Requals went down to the wire as usual. Due to great support from Kurt Vella it was a easier than prior years, but I am sure he didn't see it that way. Branch are being stricter on the deadlines and this meant that three bronzes missed the cut-off due to being unavailable or away. A couple of other patrollers awards were similarly missed.
- First Aid award status was maintained across the season building on the improvements from prior years. The merits of training our new Bronzes up to a higher standard under the 'Provide First Aid' Award was again proven. We achieved an advanced resuscitation award holder on each Patrol.
- IRB Driver and Crew was tough going again but we just about maintained a full crew for each patrol.
- No SRCs and this was a big disappointment. With only me as the resource we could not do an SRC pre-Xmas and post Xmas we had too many conflicts with winter sports starting up. I will prioritise in new season.
- Working closely and getting great support from other Clubs especially Umina, Ocean Beach and Macs.
- The SLSA's over 60 program 'Silver Salties' continues but only really covering the Frigid Digits
- The Frigid Digits go from strength to strength and deserve their own section
  - Over 50 members swimming each Sunday throughout winter
  - Appearances at the Northern Districts and Australian Winter Swimming Championship
  - Australian record holder in age group with Paula Dryden
  - Australian Winter Swimmer Relay Champions – huge achievement in beating major Clubs such as the Bondi Icebergs



- o Members have come forward to start a 'Frigid Digits' patrol
- o Contributing to the Club with a well-received Curry Night and other social events
- o A continued supply of RSAs to help behind the bar

## GOING FORWARD

Recruit more Bronzes and Surf Rescue Certificate – Again the Community Day worked ok this year with a good turnout but few adult joiners. I believe we need to be smarter in assisting candidates through that initial 'Am I up to it' phase. This is particularly the case with the swim pre-qual.

Requals – Focusing on the Patrol Captain to sign off has really helped. This means the Patrol Captain is confirming capability and compliance for their own patrollers. It is still a massive amount of my time September to December – every weekend from October. Less touch and go this season but the last couple of weeks in December is a ridiculously pressured time

SRC to BM – The SRC stream coming through to BM is very important to the club to maintain patrols numbers and ability. They are also just an awesome group of great teenagers and a real credit to the Club. Unfortunately, SLSA have completely stuffed up the simplified transition process and paperwork. So, we will have to put them through a full Bronze to overcome this impact.

IRB – As with last we are struggling for crew and drivers despite numbers being ok this year. The big efforts from Scott Leivesley and now John Cvetko have made a difference and I am sure this will carry through into the new season. We will still work closely with OB and Umina for new awards and requals.

First Aid – First Aid requirements are continually moving and changing. We survived major changes to the ART award and hopefully we can build on our existing awards to maintain full compliance with our agreed award staffing levels.

Other awards and training – We are running a 'Remote First Aid' course in July and we have opened this and other first aid courses to all members and the community.

## COMMENTARY

So not so pessimistic this year and signs of slowly regaining the capability in training the Club must have to survive. But the role is not easy and experience uneven.

For a small Club we have achieve great results due to the commitment of our trainers and members.

Firstly, the not so good. Branch did not support us this year as they have in the past. We needed their help to get our Bronze training group through the assessment and this was not forthcoming. Eventually with the great support of Craig we appealed directly to the Clubs and got our Bronzies through. This had material impacts on our training schedule and personally was not a pleasant time.

I still think we are too small a Club to sustain a full training function. I believe that there should be better co-ordination across the Clubs and training should have several Clubs participating and co-ordinated by Branch. I realise this means some independence will have to be lost but our focus must be on our core mission.

Training compliance and requirements are continually changing. The paperwork requirements are particularly onerous. To keep ahead of the changes in awards is a significant effort alone.

We suffer from an SLSA mentality that all Clubs are the same and I look across at the larger Clubs with four and five trainers across their awards. I can only run so many courses and with the added responsibility of requals something must give. Unfortunately, this year it was the SRC group.

Slowly I am seeing a better thought process from SLSA in terms of what is actually needed rather than the historic 'form' over 'substance' approach. For example, a change whereby only one mentored course



for new trainers is needed. This would have saved me a whole year in becoming a trainer. We need more of this across the Education role.

New technology and better software is promised by SLSA. The Assessors app finally looks viable and could save a lot of time.

As with last year and finishing on a positive note if I have made even the smallest of contributions to skilling up or supporting our patrollers I have been amply rewarded.

**1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 2009*, the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991* and associated regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Killcare Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is an association registered under the *Associations Incorporations Act 2009* and domiciled in New South Wales.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purpose of complying with the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commissions Act 2012* and associated regulations. The Executive Committee have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of the Killcare Surf Life Saving Club Limited.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the AASB and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements'; AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows'; AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors'; AASB 1048 'Interpretations of Standards'; AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures' as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

**Accounting Policies**

**Revenue**

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the Association and the revenue can be reliably measured.

*Sale of goods*

Sale of goods revenue is recognised at the point of sale, which is when the customer takes receipt of the goods, the risks and rewards are transferred to the customer and there is a valid sales contract. Amounts disclosed as revenue are net of sales returns and discounts.

*Functions and Events*

Revenue from functions and events are recognised once the event is held in the Club facilities and has met its obligations to provide a venue for the expressed purpose agreed with the parties. The receipts and deposits take are treated as deferring functions and events revenue liabilities until the events is completed.

*Membership fees*

Revenue from membership fees is recognised at time of receipt.

*Grants and donations*

Grant & donation income is recognised as revenue when received unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as prepaid income on the balance sheet.

*Interest*

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

**Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

**Plant and Equipment / Surf Patrol Equipment**

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised in the profit or loss as revaluation decreases if the impairment losses relate to the revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

**Depreciation**

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, including buildings and capitalised lease assets is depreciated on a straight line or diminishing-value basis over the asset's useful life to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

Plant and Equipment	5 - 25%
Surf Patrol & Sports Equipment	10 – 20%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss in the period which they arise. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

**Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

**Goods and Services Tax**

Revenues, expenses and assets recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included in other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

**Income Tax**

As the Association is a charitable institution in the terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

**Trade and Other Payables**

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

**Comparative Figures**

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

**Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements**

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.
